





NRM collection

The interactive map shows the growth and consolidation of railways in South Australia. Features a large map of South Australia, with the network of railway lines lit up by LED lights.

Students will be able to step through timelines of railways in South Australia, watching as railway lines slowly radiated out from Adelaide, and early short disconnected railway lines, built from regional towns to nearby ports, were joined to form an impressive railway network.

See which railways existed around Bob's lifetime of 1878 – 1895.

Moving into modern times, watch as lines were closed, the national railway network became privatised and standardised, as the railways faced pressure from road transport and economic changes.
